
Registration is quite easy

Step 1: Go to Http://members.hcra.org

Step 2: You will see what is only available to the public, you need to register an account. Click on the registration link on the upper right side of the page




Step 3: General rules of the forum, if you agree press the "I Agree To These Terms" button below the text.




Step 4:

This is where you would need to enter a username, e-mail and password. We strongly suggest that you use your callsign. If you don't use your callsign, the registration process will take longer and there is a chance that we will be un-able to confirm your membership. We also use CAPTCHA as way to deter spammers from creating accounts. When filled out properly, an e-mail will be sent to the address provided to confirm that you created an account and that your e-mail is active

Step 5: Just sit back and wait. A HCRA forum administrator has to manually confirm that you are indeed a current member of HCRA. This could take anywhere from a few hours to a day or two. You will not be able to participate until approved by an admin. Once approved you will have access to post, I would suggest going through your options so you could be notified by e-mail if any activity takes place.



Above is a sample of the areas you can post threads in. Sub forums will be deleted and/or added as requested by the membership. Even though participation is not mandatory by any means, this board was created by requests from you, the member. It's there for you to use.

There will be a dedicated class to installing and using the electronic logging and control software "DX Labs Suite". This class is Free to any HCRA member willing to participate. We have a very knowledgeable membership and we should group together and share what we know with each other. It could lead to an easier and more enjoyable experience in amateur radio. If this class is a success, it's almost certain that we will do more. A big thanks for Gary Fields (WA1MOW), Juergen Malner (NV1Q) and John Plaster (K1VOI) for stepping up to help make it happen.

We've also created an online forum/message board due to a few requests from members. It's there for the membership to use. With these forums, you will be able to ask you fellow member's questions, sell gear and even just chat amongst each other. Information will be available in ZB and on the website.

Even though Field Day is 5 months away, we need to start planning for it because it will be here before you know it. So far we have a couple volunteers already signed up to help but we need more to help with setup, operation, public relations and tear down. THE AMATEUR RADIO PARITY ACT OF 2015:

The ARRL has announced that currently they have 118 co-sponsors for US House Bill HR-1301. There is now 2 members of Congress from Massachusetts, District #2 James McGovern (D), and District #5 Katherine Clark (D), District #1 (Where most of the HCRA resides.) Richard Neil has yet to sign on. It is time for us to step up and get involved. You can find more information on getting involved here.

Senate Bill S-1685 currently has only 2 co-sponsors: Sen Roger Wicker of Mississippi , and Sen Richard Blumenthal of Connecticut.

There has been a hearing in front of House Subcommittee on Communications and Technology . It where the bill was well received. Committee Members were aggressively questioning representatives from the Homeowners Associations. One Committee Member accused the associations of using false scare tactics and spreading lies in describing the bill to it's members.





Homeowners Associations across the country have been mobilizing against both bills. They have been using scare tactics to get their members to write opposing letters to members of Congress.



Last year a Firefighter/Paramedic lost her life because of Carbon Monoxide poisoning in New Hampshire. She went outside to the garage to check on her generator, and was overcome by CO. Every door and window were open, she got caught in a pocket, and was quickly rendered unconscious.



HCRA MEMBER'S PROFILE



- 7) Favorite Band(s): Presently my latest challenge is 160 meters or whatever is open at the time!
- 8) Favorite Mode(s): CW because it's so simple but most any mode fine. Over the years I've tried al most everything except fast scan TV. Recently I've started to dabble with JT65. Like everything else in ham radio there's always something new to try.
- **Year you were first licensed and license class:** 1976 as a Novice. I sweated those 10 questions and the code exam. Upgraded the following year to General at an FCC session in Hartford, then to Extra in the early 1990's.
- 10) How did you become interested in amateur radio? I always liked radio as a kid. I can remember when I was 9 or 10 years old listening to BCBDX on my mom's kitchen radio. Later my father showed me short wave on an old Zenith, way cool! Then I got into the 'gateway drug' of the time, Heathkit. Built an AR3 receiver that I still own, plus a lot of other Heath gear along the way to feed my addiction. Today we have Makers, Arduino and 3D printing. Different stuff but just as addicting!
- **11)** What are some of your favorite aspects of the hobby? Most everything really. I enjoy DX'ing and contesting but everything from digital to portable operation from SOTA to FD are enjoyable.
- 12) What is your most memorable experience in the hobby? There's a lot, here's a few examples:
 - 1. Hooking up a \$10 fleamarket Heathkit SB10 sideband adapter to my Johnson Viking for my first SSB contact, probably around 1978.
 - 2. While activating a SOTA summit making an RTTY contact solely on my KX3 (no PC or netbook) to Italy.
 - 3. Administering VE exams. I've been helping with exams for over twenty years now, still remember a few young ladies that came all the way from the Albany area for their exams. One of them went home with the General, the other an Extra. Oh, I think they were aged 9 and 11!
- 13) If different from the above question, what was your most memorable contact on the radio? All contacts are memorable in some way, I can't say any one of them would stand above another.
- 14) What do you feel ham radio operators must do to help ensure the future of the hobby? The simple and most important answer is simply, "be active and 'on the air" No matter what we think our hobby should be if we don't actually *USE* it no one will ever see the exciting things it has to offer and others will want to acquire our valuable spectrum for other uses. Like almost everything else in life "use it or lose it" applies or amateur radio.
